

PUBLIC NOTICE

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER **Archie PWS Failure to Meet Monthly Turbidity and Disinfection Reporting Requirements**

Este informe contiene información muy importante sobre su agua potable. Tradúzcalo o hable con alguien que lo entienda bien.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. We are also required to report monthly drinking water test results to the Missouri Department of Natural Resources by the tenth of the following month. Specifically, we failed to submit the monthly disinfection and turbidity report for the October 2024 monitoring period to the department by November 10, 2024, in violation of state and federal monitoring and reporting requirements.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time.

During the month of October, the disinfection and turbidity report was mailed three days late to DNR. This gave us a "reporting" violation for the month of November. It is corrected but public must be made aware. If you would like to view the violation, go to dnr.mo.gov/DWW/DNRLogin.jsp, once there, click on public access. In the box for water system name, type archie, then scroll to bottom of page and click on find city, then click on water system number. This will allow you to view.
